#### **SCHOLARSHIP INSTRUCTIONS**

### Purpose of the Scholarship Fund

The Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Scholarship Fund exists to honor Rev. King's ministry and perpetuate his Christian values, particularly for the benefit of students and communities within the Greater Detroit District of the United Methodist Church. Scholarship recipients may be awarded up to \$1,000 at the discretion of the Celebration Committee.

### **Application Packet Requirements (3)**

- 1. Submission of the Application Packet electronically (PDF) by high school seniors.
- 2. Submission of two (2) letters of recommendation: a letter from your pastor **and** a letter from another adult such as a leader in your church, teacher, or counselor. These should attest to your membership and participation in the United Methodist Church as well as your adherence to Rev. King's values.
- 3. Submission of an essay (typed, double-spaced, 12-point Times New Roman font, 500 words) using the theme: "Continuing the Dream" Dr. King dreamed of a world where equality, education, service, and justice were the pillars on which decisions were made and where individuals' rooted their character. Reflect on why it is important in our world today that we continue to cultivate that dream in our society. Where do you see bridges that still need building? How are you actively making a conscious choice to ignite change and bring those pillars to light?

#### **Evaluation Criteria**

- Evidence that the applicant understands Rev. King's ministry and his Christian values.
- Examples of the applicant's activities that implement Rev. King's ministry, his dream, and/or stance on social justice.
- Writing that expresses how an applicant has been inspired by Rev. King and is likely to inspire others.

Your electronic PDF Application, Letters of Recommendation, and Essay must be emailed on or before October 13, 2023 (11:59 pm EST) to MLK@greaterdetroitumc.org.
