SCHOLARSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

Purpose of the Scholarship Fund

The Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Scholarship Fund exists to honor Dr. King's ministry and perpetuate his Christian values, particularly for the benefit of students and communities within the Greater Detroit District of the United Methodist Church. Scholarship recipients may be awarded up to \$1,000 at the discretion of the Celebration Committee.

Application Packet Requirements (3)

- 1. Submission of the Application Packet electronically (PDF) by <u>current high school seniors</u> within the Greater Detroit District.
- 2. Submission of two (2) letters of recommendation: a letter from your pastor **and** a letter from another adult such as a leader in your church, teacher, or counselor. These should attest to your membership and participation in the United Methodist Church as well as your adherence to Dr. King's values.
- 3. Submission of an essay (typed, double-spaced, 12-point Times New Roman font, 500 words) using the theme: "Honoring the Journey" Dr. King knew that the important things in life were worth fighting for. He urged us to remember that even though we may not be able to do it all, we can do some, and we can choose to keep fighting for change. Reflect on why it is important in our world today that we push the arm of justice forward, even despite the many obstacles present. Where do you witness the need to fly—or run—or walk—or crawl—in our society? How are you actively making a conscious choice to ignite change and move forward for the greater good?

Evaluation Criteria

- Evidence that the applicant understands Dr. King's ministry and his Christian values.
- Examples of the applicant's activities that implement Dr. King's ministry, his dream, and/or stance on social justice.
- Writing that expresses how an applicant has been inspired by Dr. King and is likely to inspire others.

Your electronic PDF Application, Letters of Recommendation, and Essay must be emailed on or before October 13, 2024 (11:59 pm EST) to MLK@greaterdetroitumc.org.
